HOW TO PRACTICE & REHEARSE WELL

Effective practice does not just mean playing a piece all the way through a few times.

When we practice with others we call it a rehearsal. Here are some tips for both:

- Take your time. Make sure someone counts in (1,2,3,4 - musicians never count in backwards!)
- Don't ignore mistakes.Stop and fix them.
- Make sure the beginning and ending are tidy and polished - no speaking, you need to agree nonverbal signals.
- If there is a tricky bit, practice it over and over (10 times is not too many!) until you have got it securely.
